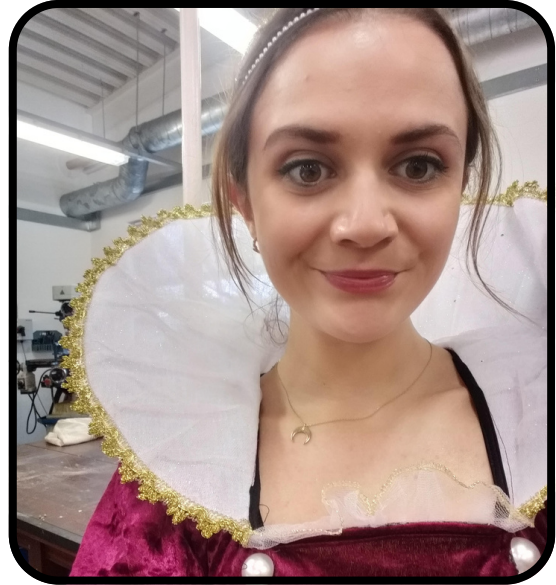
Martha Rail
